One of the teachers said the following at our last gathering in our Startalk training in UVa, *This is a beginning, not an end!* 

Yes, for me, the end of this 3-week Startalk teacher training program means it is a starting point. What lies ahead of me in my career is a blank piece of paper that hopefully, I can draw some beautiful pictures onto it with some beautiful colors.

I am a licensed Special Education teacher for three years and have worked with students with disabilities in various public schools in the Fairfax County for the last nine years. On weekends I have taught Chinese at a heritage school for two years. This January I decided to take a graduate class to learn about the theory-based methodology in teaching Chinese and finished it in May. Thus I have some ideas about the theories in Second Language Acquisition, the methodology, and experience in teaching Chinese before I came.
