I taught ESL for high schools in China for years before I came to US seven years ago. I am currently working at Woodstock High School District in IL teaching Chinese Level I, II, III and AP.

My educational experience in the U.S. includes obtaining a Masters Degree in Education from Alverno College and completing the coursework at UW-Milwaukee for certification in teaching Mandarin. My Masters Degree studies provided me with a vision of American education as a whole, with a focus on classroom instruction, methodology, curriculum development and assessment design for a variety of language proficiency levels. My Masters research titled "Standards-based Instruction in a Chinese Language Class in Wisconsin Schools" extended my knowledge of Chinese language education nationwide and increased my awareness of the educator's role. My research also provided an overall insight of what standards mean to students, producing standards-based curriculum and assessment, and creating learning situations that improve student comprehension and communication skills in target language..

In the World Language Certification program at UW-Milwaukee, I studied the history, politics, and social contexts of bilingual education in the United States, current research regarding educational applied linguistics and second language acquisition as well as best educational practices for minority language students.
