As a native Chinese-speaker, I have always been enjoying teaching Chinese, both the Chinese language and the Chinese culture. Even though I was an English major student in college in China, I have been passionate about teaching Chinese since I started my Chinese teaching career.

Since I came to United States in 2009, I have tutored a number of English-speaking students Chinese who were at beginning or advanced level. In 2010, I started to teach a Chinese class in Philadelphia as a part-time teacher. It was that teaching experience that made me to realize how passionate I could be when I taught Chinese. During my teaching experience in Philadelphia, I adapted the curriculum, created many supplementary language materials and tried to make my class as interesting and student-centered as possible.

With determination to pursue my passion in Chinese language teaching, I started my teaching career at Harvard-Westlake school, a private school in California.
